My personal, professional and academic interest in Social Value stems from working within the social enterprise sector for over 20 years.

When in 2004 I set up an independent manufacturing business in Vietnam based on principles of ethical, sustainable and fair manufacturing policies, I was for the large part humoured for being conscientious by suppliers, retailers and consumers. There was rarely a week when I wasn't asked what I was trying to communicate in practical terms.

When I returned to the UK and established a further registered social enterprise manufacturing business on home turf in South Wales in 2011, the term "Social Value" - whether in terms of ecologically, ethically or person-centred relevance — was still in its infancy and, from the perspective of front-line business, a relative unknown for consumers when considering their purchasing decisions.

Although commercial perception of Social Value in

business has moved on and grown into its own ambitions, I know that, rather like driving a car when I first passed my driving test, I was driving without understanding how the machine was put together, how it functioned and what I should learn before it broke down or what to avoid before I had an accident or did damage with my new found enthusiasm and freedom.

This year I have graduated with distinction in a Masters in International Innovation Management from University of Wales Trinity St David. My thesis focussed on 'The must-have imperative of Social Value. Causal effects of globalisation and reflections on the future of ethics in business' and I look forward to sharing my thought process and conclusions, repugnant and otherwise with no holds barred reflections on my life adventures since leaving Dynevor in 1982.
